New vocabulary

Revelation – a communication of idea, command and information from Allah to a chosen human being.

Prophet – a person regarded as an inspired teacher or proclaimer of the will of God.

Sacred – connected with God and so deserving veneration

Monotheistic – the doctrine or belief that there is only one God.

Abution – the act of washing oneself.

Purifying – make ceremonially clean. 'A ritual bath to purify the soul.'

Guidance – advice or information aimed at resolving a problem or difficulty.
